

Installation and Disk Guide for OAC Phase I Disks

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Instructions for Loading and Running OAC Phase I disks and program-Disks 1-3 (Windows 95 and higher):

Installing the Program/Document Reader (Disks 1-3)

1. Place Disk 1 in your CD-ROM drive.
2. Click on “Start” on the main Windows toolbar.
3. Click on “Run”.
4. Click on “Browse”
5. Find your CD-ROM drive letter and double click on that icon.
6. Find the “Setup.exe” file and click on it, then select the “Open” option.
7. In the “Run” window, click on “Okay”.
8. Follow all steps during installation to load the program on your hard drive.

Running the Program (Disks 1-3)

1. Click on “Start” on the main Windows toolbar.
2. Click on “Programs”
3. Find the program folder titled “AMEDD OAC” and highlight it until a Phase I icon appears and click on it.

Once the program has been installed, you can run any disk to begin a module on that disk (i.e., you don’t have to put in Disk 1 each time you run the program). Disks may be swapped out at any time during the process to access modules that are located on a different disk.

Note: On your “Programs” folder (in both the “Start” menu and on the drive you installed the program) Disks 1-3 are accessed via the “AMEDD OAC” name/icon. Disks 4-8 will be under the “Officer Advanced Course” name/icon.

Instructions for Loading and Running OAC Phase I disks and program-Disks 4-8 (Windows 95 and higher):

Note: Disks 4-8 were developed by a separate contractor. In some instances Disk 4 is referred to as Disk 1 when running the actual program.

Installing the Program (Disks 4-8)

1. Place Disk 4 in your CD-ROM drive. (If you install the program using the “My Computer” icon on your desk top, your CD-ROM icon will have the name of the CD in it as “OAC 1”. Don’t panic...the second contractor called that OAC 1. It is Disk 4)

2. Click on “Start” on the main Windows toolbar.
3. Click on “Run”.
4. Click on “Browse”
5. Find your CD-ROM drive letter and double click on that icon.
6. Find the “Setup.exe” file and click on it, then select the “Open” option.
7. In the “Run” window, click on “Okay”.
8. Follow all steps during installation to load the program on your hard drive
9. A shortcut to the program for Disks 4-8 is not automatically installed with this portion of the program. See Creating a Shortcut below.

Video Settings Check (if having video display problems with the program)

1. Click on “Start” on the main Windows toolbar.
2. Click on “Settings”
3. Click on “Control Panel”
4. Double click “Display”
5. Click on the “Settings” tab.
6. Confirm that your settings are either “True Color” or “High Color, 16 Bit”. If you have an older computer system, try the “High Color, 16 Bit” settings first when changing your video configuration. Your viewing size should be at 800x600 or better to display the video graphics.
--Windows may ask you to restart your computer if you change your video settings. This is normal.

Creating a Shortcut

1. Find the “OAC” folder on the drive you installed Disks 4-8. It is probably located in the “Programs” folder unless you changed where you wanted it installed.
2. Double click on the “OAC” folder.
3. Find the file with an icon that says “OACMenu”.
4. **Right** click on this icon once. Click on “Create a Shortcut”
5. Click, hold, and drag the newly-created shortcut to your Windows desktop for ease of access.
(Note: you may have to modify the size of your open window screen to be able to drag this shortcut to your desktop)

Renaming the Shortcut Icon(s)

--You should have two shortcuts to OAC Phase I programs on your desk top at this time. It may get confusing which icon goes with the appropriate portion of the course you are working on. Follow the steps below to rename the icon. Names given are up to you, but feel free to use our suggestion given.

1. On your desktop, click **once** on the icon you wish to change the name of. “AMEDD OAC – Phase I” is the icon for Disks 1-3. “OACMenu” is the icon for Disks 4-8.
2. After a slight pause, click on it again to edit the name.
3. If changing the Disks 1-3 icon, change the name to “AMEDD OAC – Disks 1-3”
4. If changing Disks 4-8 icon, change the name to “AMEDD OAC – Disks 4-8”.
